CORRECTIONS REPORT

Simply because we are blessed to have such dedicated, passionate volunteers, the Corrections Committee is going gang busters! It is such a pleasure to have a front row seat to God's Miracles.

We currently have 25+ volunteers going into 8 facilities. Brown Creek Minimum Security Prison has five regular approved volunteers with at least two more pending. The Anson County Women's Facility just got four more women cleared to take meetings, bringing us to six women (and one man) to cover a meeting that was really struggling to get approved AA members. Our volunteers at Mecklenburg County Correctional have increased, and currently all meetings are being covered regularly. We continue to have a strong presence at Gaston County, Dallas, Albemarle and Lincolnton facilities. Our continued efforts to bring meetings to Union County, while slow going, is starting to pay off. I am hopeful that new contacts there will result in AA meetings soon.

We are in the process of organizing our annual Corrections Service Fair in late October or early November. Once we can secure a date, there are a couple of fantastic speakers that have agreed to come to Charlotte if they are available.

Everyone I know involved in AA service work in the jails and prisons agrees that it is about the most rewarding way we have ever found to carry the message to the still suffering alcoholic. Please join us the last Saturday of every month at 10:00 at Intergroup or online.
