## NOMINATIONS & OUTREACH REPORT

The purpose of the Nominations & Outreach Committee is to help AA groups become more involved in service within the Metrolina area. Groups are encouraged to participate in the Metrolina Steering Committee Delegates Meeting, held every odd month on the third Saturday at 10:00 a.m. at the Metrolina Intergroup Office. When groups send delegates, they gain a better understanding of district decisions and have a voice in how services are carried out.

Groups can also get involved by participating in 12th Step service, such as taking meetings into treatment centers, corrections facilities, or helping with CPC/PI outreach.
